As you are probably aware we have seen an increase in problematic behaviours. Many of you will have seen the ERO report in the media last week that showed that this is common across our country. We know that in the last few years (Covid, cost of living etc) our hauora/wellbeing has taken a knock, across our country (possibly world) we see more mental health challenges, more anxiety and it seems sadly, less tolerance and understanding. We want to raise the profile and frequency of respectful behaviour and kindness.

Our Language of Learning strongly supports kindness. One of the criteria for Be Respectful is using kind words and language and the 'catch cry' of Be a Contributor is "Do Good because Good is Good to Do. We celebrate and encourage kindness.

Like any skill or attitude, be it learning long division or how to interact respectfully with others, being kind is something that is learnt and therefore as teachers and parents we teach them to be kind and care for others. Our tamariki and rangitahi need messages from us that being kind is important and that we value kindness. They need opportunities to practice being kind and to develop the habit of being kind and expressing gratitude - this might be through discussing what we are grateful for over the dinner table or expecting our children to help around the house or join us to help in the community. Making sure our children thank those who help them eg the bus driver or shop assistant helps them develop a kind and grateful attitude. It's also important they see and hear us modelling the kind of behaviour we wish for them to follow.

We are having 'Kindness Week' (well week and a half) to finish off our term where we when staff spot a kind action or hear kind words and these will go into prize draws. Teachers will also be teaching around kindness and promoting the concept or 'slogan' WHAT'S INSIDE?



REREMOANA TEACHER ONLY DAY

Last Thursday the staff at Reremoana Kura were fortunate enough to be taken on a haerenga of Manurewa, led by Manurewa Marae. We were so excited about the opportunity to connect with our marae, and felt privileged to have been shared into the kōrero/narrative and local pūrākau/stories. We used the phrase "Walking our Pepeha" as we were taken to many places on our Kura Pepeha. We started at Manurewa Marae, followed by Te Manukanuka o Hoturoa moana, Maunga Matukutururu, Maunga Matukutureia and Te-pu-anga Maara Puhinui Awa.

At the end of our day, the staff at Reremoana reflected on how special this day was. Our kaiako have brainstormed ways in which we can honour what was shared, to ensure we are passing this onto our ākonga and whānau. Keep a look out through class learning as we continue to expand our knowledge and understanding of Manurewa and the tūpuna significant to our local area. TE WHAKAPAPA O REREMOANA



Our school name Reremoana was gifted to us by our iwi Ngāti Te Akitai Waiohua. Reremoana te Mahia is an important tupuna of Manurewa. She lived roughly 10 generations ago. Mahia road is named after Reremoana te Mahia to help keep the tūpuna name alive through our everyday lives. Her father is Wirihana the great chief and grandfather, Ihaka Takaanini. These tūpuna live through the kōrero shared with us and through our acknowledgement of who they are and why they are significant to Manurewa. These names are also reflected in local place names.

REREMOANA SCHOOL 2024 YEARBOOK


Every year we produce a high quality book of memories, by way of the Reremoana School Yearbook.

Mathseeds and Reading Eggs

Reading Eggs and Mathseeds are one part of our Home Learning Programme

in Te Puna. They are well known, engaging online programmes and will be used to support learning in Te Puna (Year 0-3) this year. **You can pay for your child's digital subscription via Hero.**

They are both located within one app with one sign in code (given by the teacher when payment is made).

They start with placement tests to ensure your child is in the correct starting place for their learning level (if you helped with this placement test please contact your kaitiaki teacher and this test can be reset).

Reading Eggs has 4 parts to it - A Library, Fast Phonics (great reinforcement of sound knowledge), Reading Eggs (working at own pace around the map, linking to our segmenting and blending work we do in our BSLA Reading Programme) then extending into Reading Express (for those that have moved onto Reading Comprehension and Vocabulary).

Mathseeds also follows a map system starting with a placement test to ensure correct starting placement. Once this map is completed it extends into Mathseeds Prime where the children work through different Maths Strands at their own pace.

Both these programmes are able to have teachers set tasks to reinforce class learning- these tasks will have to be completed before your child can then continue on their journey around the map.

As the children become more independent in navigating these programmes there will be in-class opportunities to have time on them during our Reading and Maths Programmes.

Education Perfect is a learning website which students at Reremoana use in Years 4-8 for learning at school and at home. It covers content from across the New Zealand Curriculum and is relevant to our context in Aotearoa. Students are signed up using their National Student Number - meaning that if their next school uses Education Perfect, their progress will be kept. It is worth noting that many of our local secondary schools do use Education Perfect.

We have had some questions about Education Perfect (and keep them coming - we love to help) so I have put together this video to answer some of these. Please sit with you child and their device and have them show you what they are learning.

There is an option for you to be signed up to Parent Emails for Education Perfect - if you opt in to this you will be sent information on your child's upcoming due dates.

KIWI COMPETITIONS

If you would like to enter your child into the Kiwi Competitions - Please complete <u>this form</u> and pay for participation by the 10th of May.

The University of Canterbury is offering your child the opportunity to participate in the KIWI English, Mathematics and Science competitions.

These competitions take place annually and are designed by New Zealand teachers for New Zealand students based on the New Zealand Curriculum. For further information, please consult the CAM website www.canterbury.ac.nz/cam. The competitions are open to all Year 5-8 students in English, Mathematics and Science. Students can enter in one or more subjects. Each competition will provide

parents/caregivers with an individual student report of their child's overall performance.

These are available through your school. The supervised online tests will take place in the last 3 weeks of Term 2 and the first week of Term 3. The competitions are to be

administered at school under exam conditions and supervised. All participating students will receive a certificate and a prize will be awarded to the top student nationally in each competition. If two or more students share the same top score then the prize is awarded to the student with the highest speed and accuracy.


Concussion Recovery Assessment of New Zealanders in Adolescence and Childhood



We are looking for families of children and teenagers (age 5-17 years) who have had a concussion or mild TBI in the last ten days, to take part in a study to find out how long it takes them to recover.

We would like to talk to families up to five times over the 6 months after injury. The interviews can be conducted by phone, on zoom, or in person at a time that suits you. Each participating family will be given a \$20 voucher for each assessment in appreciation of your time.

What will you have to do?

Parents/Guardians and children/youth will be asked questions about their health, feelings and behaviour, and usual activities. We would like to talk to you soon after the injury, then at 1 month, 3 months, and 6 months to find out about your recovery. We can talk to you on the phone, on zoom, or in person.
