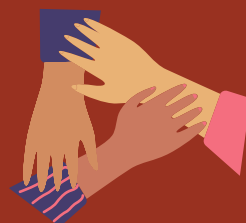

Applications for these out of zone spaces close on 15 August, 3pm. If more applications are received than places a ballot will be held on August 22nd. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within 3 school days of the ballot being held.

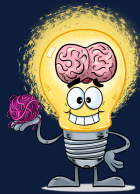

REREMOANA SCHOOL MOVE-ATHON!

Every second year we do an 'athon' as a major fundraiser as well as a learning opportunity linked to our curriculum - you might remember 2022's Spell-athon. This year we are doing a Move-athon! For 2 weeks our students will be stepping, jumping, dancing, running and moving through this Move-a-thon to get fit, active, and support our school. Funds raised by this super active and fun Move-athon will be put towards wet day board games for the classrooms to ease those rainy lunchtimes, as well as our big new project: a carved waharoa for the entrance to our school that pays respect to our mana whenua, the history and name of the school, and celebrates our cultural diversity. By supporting this fundraiser you are encouraging our tamariki to be active, have some fun, and also making our school be a better place for all our students. Thank you for supporting Reremoana School.

How does a Move-athon work? Students will set a goal that requires them to move more than they usually do, over a 2 week period, 5-18th August. Over these 2 weeks they will record their moving activity on the log sheet that has come home with this notice. There will be activities before and after school and during break times for students to opt into. Keep an eye on HERO and Facebook for information about some community based activities/after school activities. On Friday 16th August we'll have a grand Move-athon event at school with lots of fun movement activities for students to participate in and to help them reach their goal.

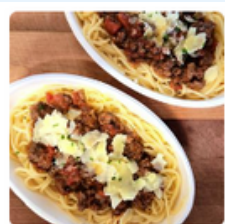

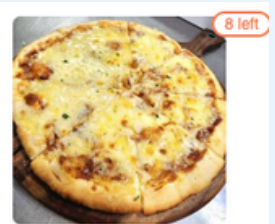

DROP ZONE REMINDERS

If you have parked and left your vehicle on the school side of the drop zone in the mornings, you may have found a friendly reminder tucked under your windscreen wiper.

When cars are parked and left here, the flow of the drop zone is impeded by the lack of space. If you need to park in the mornings, please do so safely on the road, or neighbouring streets,

The flow is also affected by cars stopping just inside the entrance to the drop zone by the yellow poles by the hall, and letting children out. This is unsafe and also not helpful for keeping the drop zone flowing successfully.

Another helpful thing to do is to drive up to the top of the drop zone as opposed to waiting or taking the parks closest to the gates. It won't hurt your child/ren to walk a few metres further.

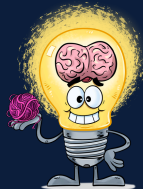

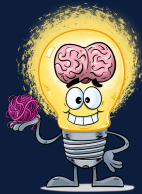
