I'm writing this while at the annual New Zealand Principals' Federation Conference in Ōtautahi, Christchurch. Being that it is Te Wiki o te Reo Māori, it felt fitting that our first keynote speaker was Dr Hana O'Regan ONZM, a passionate advocate of the Māori language and daughter of Sir Tipene O'Regan, an education lecturer and historian.

The theme of Te Wiki o te Reo Māori this year is 'Ake, Ake, Ake - a Forever Language'. The official website explains the theme represents "the resilience, adaptability and endurance of our language. It also reflects the commitment New Zealanders have to embracing and learning te reo Māori long into the future. Under enduring pressure te reo Māori has shown it will adapt and survive. It grows with our people, our culture and our environment."

To understand the importance of the theme and it's explanation it's important to understand some the history of te reo Māori. By 1970 only 5% of tamariki Māori could speak te reo Māori, after years of the language being banned in schools and children being beaten and punished for speaking te reo Māori. In her keynote Hana unpacked how the destruction the language is a part of the blueprint of colonisation, worldwide. No matter who the colonisers were (or are) the destruction of the indigenous language (and culture) is a pattern. Dr O'Regan gave the examples of the destruction of the Welsh and Irish (Gaelic) languages as well as more recent examples from places such as Uganda. The loss of language and culture leads to the breakdown of cohesion and community, which then also impacts on economic and social outcomes.

Like other countries who have fought to save and protect their indigenous languages (and cultures), there has been a strong positive movement throughout Aotearoa New Zealand to embrace te reo Māori as a taonga (treasure).

Stats NZ reports that "since 2018, the proportion of people able to speak more than a few words or phrases of te reo Māori rose from 24% to 30%. The proportion of people able to speak te reo Māori at least fairly well also increased to 7.9% in 2021," and "in the latest data, almost a quarter (23 percent) of Māori said they spoke te reo Māori as one of their first languages, up from 17 percent in 2018." That is positive progress!

We are very proud at Reremoana to be a part of that commitment and to be supporting all our ākonga to have at least some knowledge, understanding and respect for te reo Māori. While events such as Te Wiki o te Reo Māori highlight and celebrate this commitment, it is a valued part of our school's practice on a daily basis.

And as Dr Hana O'Regan said this morning: Kia tū takitahi, me mātua ū takitini - If we wish to stand as one, we must first all collectively commit.
