At Reremoana School, we ensure we keep up to date with current research and developments in the field of education. This means our teachers and leadership team are well informed and make strategic, purposeful decisions around teaching and learning strategies and approaches for all of our learners.

Our Teacher Only Day on 31 May was one of the 2 teacher only days provided by the Ministry of Education around curriculum changes (the 2nd one is Tuesday 29 October) Our focus was around the science of learning which is a current priority for the Ministry of Education. Better Start Literacy Approach (BSLA) our structured literacy programme is an example of an approach that explicitly uses science of learning informed strategies.

The Education Hub explains that 'The science of learning draws on research from cognitive psychology, neuroscience and education to understand the processes through which we learn. While there is a focus on the cognitive processes involved in learning, the science of learning also recognises that cognition is affected by affective, emotional and contextual factors.'

The science of learning shows us how memory works and how new information is learnt and remembered through processes like linking new learning to prior knowledge and understandings. Our brains can get overwhelmed if our brains are trying to process too much new information as our working memory has limited capacity. It's vital that we provide opportunities for practicing of new learning and that teachers provide specific feedback along the way.



The science of learning also reflects concepts such as motivation and self-regulation as being key to learning along with a sense of self-belief in our ability to learn. The science of learning links to many of our other professional learning as well as the practices we know well and already ensure are part of our daily teaching and learning.

Our teachers are also working through the Teaching Councils' Unteach Racism resources. These were created with the Human Rights Commission. Our focus has been on how to respond to racism both from individuals and systems. Racism can be uncomfortable to talk about and we want to ensure we can lean in and confront it through safe and productive conversations.

We want to ensure our teachers have all the update knowledge and skills that ensure they continue to be the best teachers/kaiako of your tamariki!

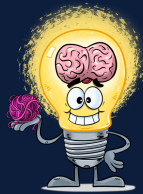


# Conifer Grove Cultural Exchange

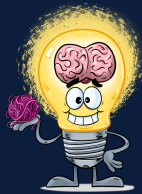

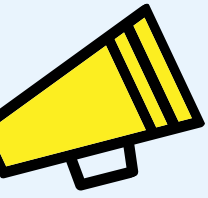
We do not have a schedule - please do not book any appointments on this day - if your child is absent when their class is called they will miss out. Sibling forms will come home a week before photo day.

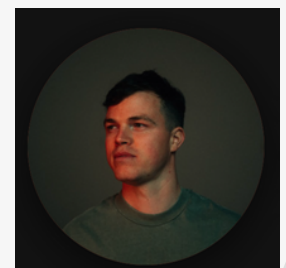
# Piano Showcase

# REREMOANA SCHOOL 2024 YEARBOOK

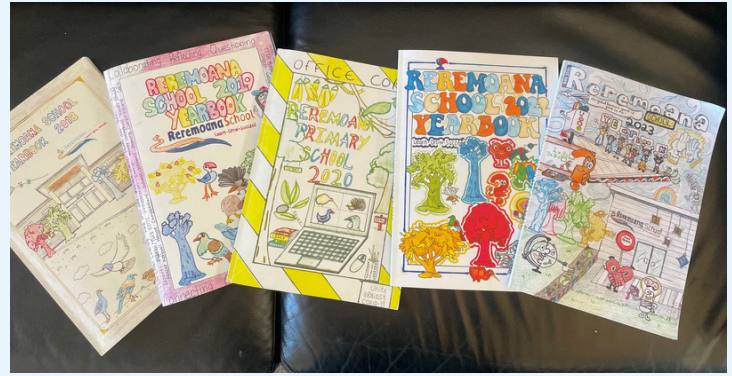
Every year we produce a high quality book of memories, by way of the Reremoana School Yearbook.
