Mānawatia a Matariki!

Matariki.co.nz explains that 'the name "Matariki" means "tiny eyes" or "eyes of god" in Māori As the stars of the Matariki cluster rise in the winter sky, they signal a time of remembrance, reflection, and renewal across Aotearoa. Matariki is a special period that connects us to the land, the sky, and each other, through a series of events, traditions, and celebrations that are deeply rooted in Māori culture. It is a time for harvesting and preparing the land for the coming year, as well as a time for honoring ancestors and engaging in cultural practices such as waiata (song), haka (dance), and kai (food).'

Matariki has become an important celebration in the Reremoana School calendar for both our tamariki's learning as well as coming together as a community.

Each of our hubs have created an amazing display to teach others around one of the 9 whetū/stars of Matariki. Each of the whetū is linked to an aspect of wellbeing and the environment:

- Matariki people's health and wellbeing
- Tupu-ā-rangi things that grow up in trees, including fruits, berries and birds
- Waipuna-ā-rangi rainfall
- Waitī freshwater bodies and foods from these waters
- Uru<mark>rangi the w</mark>inds
- Tupu-ā-nuku food that is gathered/harvested from the soil
- Waitā- the ocean and foods that come from it
- Pohutukawa those who have passed on
- Hiwa-i-te-rangi attainment of goals.

At our Matariki celebration tonight we look forward to sharing our displays with you all as well as our Kapa Haka performing and eating some kai, embodying the spirit of Matariki.

To those who have helped with our Matariki celebration, ngā mihi nui! Over the weekend I encourage you to take some time to pause and māharatia (reflect), whakanuia (celebrate) and wawatatia (aspire) and get involved in some Matariki celebrations or traditions.

We have two staff joining us part time in Term 3. Whaea Monique will be joining us as a specialist Drama teacher in Te Awa and Te Moana.


Mrs Prem Swami, who has been relieving in our school. will work two days a week in Te Awa, and will be providing release on another two days.

DROP ZONE ETIQUETTE

HOW TO USE OUR DROP ZONE

Between 8 - 9am " Drop and Go " only in the Green Zone
Fill the Green Zone from the front
Wait until you are stationary in the Green Zone to let your children out
Between 8 - 9am, staff and approved visitor parking only in the Red Zone
From 9am - 2pm the Drop Zone is available for visitor parking
From 2 - 3:15pm the Drop Zone is closed and no entry or parking is permitted



WORKING TOGETHER TO KEEP THE FLOW

Please remind anyone who drops off your children in the morning, that the school side of the drop zone is "drop and go" only - no parking and leaving your vehicle. Clogging the drop zone results in bottlenecks and compromises the safety of our tamariki exiting vehicles. If there is a bottleneck, please be patient and wait for a space rather than have your child alight from your car mid drop zone.



TINGREDITBLE SCILENCE



On Tuesday, 25th June, 30 students from Te Moana team went to the University of Auckland to experience Incredible Science.

<u>Exercise Sciences</u>: We tested our agility and tracked it using computers. We learned about the force behind our jumps, how fast we can move and how this is measured, and competed with each other.

<u>Physics</u>: This was a favourite for many of us, as there were so many hands on activities to experience. We got to ride a hovercraft, see how illusions with mirrors work, see where energy goes and the impact it leaves behind. We got to see the lecturer send a bottle rocket across the room using liquid nitrogen, and make gas flames dance using music.

Computer Science: We got to create games, code robots and design animations.


<u>Marine Science</u>: We saw starfish up close through a microscope, and learned how ocean organisms eat. It was hands on and we got to see how we as humans have an impact on the ocean.

After our rotations we went to the Magic Show, where more scientists conducted chemistry experiments in front of us and talked to us about chemical reactions. The sounds, sights, and smells were really interesting!




Coming up in Term 3:
