Recently we have had students at sports camp, competing in Rehu Tai and Mathex, and representing Reremoana at Cross Country and more. Alongside all the different activities our students are involved in, we also have high expectations of our students and their conduct. Representing our school is an honour and we expect our students to do so with pride and integrity. It is an opportunity for our students to demonstrate the Language of Learning outside of the school context. It is a source of immense pride for us when our students represent our school with pride, respect, good manners and sportsmanship.

An example of this was at Sports Camp. We have never participated in sports camp before and were competing against some schools that have much larger numbers of Year 7 and 8 students and much more experience at sports camps. It was a hard week for our students and while we didn't come away with any trophies for winning any of the huge variety of codes the students competed in, we did win sportsmanship. It's not difficult to show humility and sportsmanship when you are winning, but to show it consistently when not being so successful is a true measure of sportsmanship and integrity in my opinion. I was so incredibly proud of the resilience of our students and the way they conducted themselves.



I was also incredibly proud of our students last week when we hosted the Manurewa Rehu Tai. All 6 of our speakers placed and two of our Year 7/8 speakers will now represent Manurewa at the Auckland Rehu Tai finals.

At Reremoana we consistently 'punch above our weight' in MPSSA (Manurewa Primary School Sports Association) and CCSA (Central Counties Sports Association) events - most recently at Cross Country, with students placing at cluster events and two Y 7/8 students moving forward to compete at Auckland Cross Country.

We have such talented and hard working students who can be relied on to represent our school in the spirit of our Language of Learning.

On another note of appreciation... thank you to everyone who took the time to complete our recent Health Curriculum community survey. We had 86 responses and I want to congratulate the winners of the \$100 supermarket vouchers - Alpa Kumar, Monique Barge & Jagroop Dillon/Bhagwant Sohan. Everyone's feedback will be now used to review our curriculum statement and learning and teaching programmes. Once this work is completed it will be shared back with you.

Out of Zone Spaces 2025

The board has determined that Reremoana School has the following spaces available for Out of Zone enrolments for children to start in 2025:

- -2 spaces in each of the following: Year 0 (turning 5 and starting in Term 2-4 2025), Year 1, Year 2
- -4 spaces in each of Year 3 and Year 4
- -15 spaces in Year 5 or Year 6
- -2 spaces in Year 7

Applications for these out of zone spaces close on 15 October, 3pm. If more applications are received than places a ballot will be held on 23 October. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within 3 school days of the ballot being held.
