Teaching has always been my passion—it's what inspires me every day. I love seeing children grow, learn, and discover their potential, and I feel lucky to support them on their path.


I'm a simple and friendly person who loves exploring new things. In my spare time, you'll often find me singing and dancing—activities that bring me so much joy and energy.


TERM 1 – MONDAY 3 FEB TO FRI 11 APR Public holiday: Waitangi – Thurs 6 Feb.

JUNIOR ATHLETICS DAY TOMORROW



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Event Details:

Long Jump

Overview: Children will jump for a distance with a soft landing area.

Format: Each child gets 2 jumps, and potentially a third if time allows.

Awards: All jumps are measured, and ribbons will be awarded to the 3 students with the farthest jumps.

Chicken Throw

Overview: Children will throw a light, soft object, like a "chicken," in a style similar to a discus throw. Format: Throws will not be individually measured. Instead, students aim to throw farther than a set marker.

Awards: Only the student who achieves the farthest throw will receive a ribbon.

Special Note for 7-Year-Olds: 7-year-old boys and girls will use a softer discus for their throws. Ribbons will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place based on distance.

Shot Put

Overview: Children will use a small, soft shot put for safety, with a focus on learning correct throwing technique.

Awards: Ribbons will be awarded to the 3 students who achieve the farthest throws.

Hurdle Race

Overview: A low-hurdle course suitable for younger children, with cones marking boundaries. Awards: The first 3 students to cross the finish line in the final race will receive ribbons.

Sprint Race

Overview: A 50-metre sprint, with a shorter 30-metre race available if time permits.

Awards: Ribbons will be given to the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finishers in the final sprint race.

Moon hopper race


This will be a fun event only - no ribbons allocated. Other ball games will also be included here.

DOG SAFETY

This week we had visit from the Dog Safety team from the Animal Management. Animal Management contacted us as they frequently patrol area in the interest of reducing harm and nuisance caused by roaming dogs, and to proactively engage with the community around dog safety and responsible dog ownership.

Having some Animal Management Officers visit our kura and delivering dog safety talks to tamariki and/or kaimahi on how to stay safe around kurī, is one of the many community engagement initiatives offer by the Proactive Animal Management Team. It forms part of their campaign to reduce dog attacks around Tāmaki Makaurau, particularly on tamariki.

Helping the Animal Management officers were Rupert the beagle, Lola the griffon/pug cross and Koda, the cavoodle cross.

"Rupert is a retired border security dog. The children leant to ask the owner "is the dog sweet to meet"? They were given skills to get to know dog by offering their hand the correct way for a dog to sniff, they learned 'chin and chest is best" for a pat. Our kaitiaki were each given a stuffed toy dog for our classrooms. Kaitiaki Cowan voted to name their dog Bluey; he goes home every night with a child for an adventure and they write one sentence about their adventure with Bluey in Bluey's book. "
