# **KITES**

As part of our 'Identity' Inquiry around the legend of Manurewa,
Hub 1 and Hub 2 will be making large

### **TERM 3 CURRICULUM FOCUS:**

- **Literacy:** We use the Better Start Literacy Approach to support our tamariki in Reading, Writing and Oral Language. Keep an eye out for notices in students' Literacy Links book regarding what your child is learning and how you can support them at home.
- **Numeracy:** This term students will be working on both addition and subtraction (and multiplication and division problems as appropriate) in class, along with continuation of number knowledge which is vital for students in the foundational stages of their learning. To help at home, you can practice skip counting with your child starting with 2s, 5s and 10's, and for the Y3s rote learning 2s, 5s, 10s times tables and skip counting in 3s. We will also be exploring 'geometry'.
- **P.E:** We are lucky to be working with Counties Manukau Sport on a Fundamental Movement Skills programme. The FMS programme will be a 30 min session per week over 5 weeks. There will be a focus on balance, hop, jump, throw and catch and lastly skip. Later in the term, we will move into Athletics skills discus, shot put, long jump and sprints.
- Inquiry: We are finishing our Inquiry on 'Identity' where we have been learning about the story of Manurewa and the story of our school. We are looking forward to making kites as part of this Inquiry. We also continue our focus on Learning Through Play and using our 'shared picture books' as motivation for play provocations. Later in the term and into term 4, we will be developing further the concept of 'Sustainability' and linking this learning around 'the garden'.



# JOIN US FOR "WHĀNAU TIME!"

We would like to welcome our Te Puna whānau (parents, siblings, grandparents, aunties, uncles and other wider family) to join us on Friday 13th September (Week 8) any time between 2-3pm for an open afternoon in our Te Puna and Te Puna Iti classes.

This will be a relaxed environment where whānau are welcome to come along and join us to have a look at what our tamariki have been learning in class, and through our 'Learning Through Play' experiences.
